TERMINOLOGY

WIN: The horse you select must come in first.

PLACE: The horse you select must come in first or second.

SHOW: The horse you select must come in first, second, or third.

DAILY DOUBLE: A bet attempting to pick the winner of two consecutive races.

PICK THREE: A bet attempting to select the winners of three consecutive races.

PICK FOUR: A bet attempting to select the winners of four consecutive races.

PICK SIX: A bet attempting to select the winners of six consecutive races.

EXACTA: A bet attempting to select the first two finishers in exact order.

TRIFECTA: A bet attempting to select the first **THREE** finishers in exact order.

SUPERFECTA: A bet attempting to select the first **FOUR** finishers in exact order.

Graber hopes his 'Caviar' is top shelf

At the age of 81, Dan Graber says he's been "up and down the pike a few times." What he's never been, at least to this point, is on the road to the Hambletonian. The Indiana resident is hoping this could be the year with his homebred trotter DG's Caviar, who is undefeated in three races this season at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

DG's Caviar is the 1-5 morning-line favorite in Wednesday's \$15,000 final of the Cardinal Series at Hoosier.

Graber knows it's a long way from a conditioned series for non-winners of one race to the sport's premier event for 3-year-old trotters, but DG's Caviar has impressed him from day one.

SHEZ A SWIFT

Sat in for soft trip, cones to lane, easily best of the others. Rail again, maybe a small slice.

GRAN SAN

Sent from gate, pushed turn before yielding, back on rim far turn, put away leader, caught by fav. Similar trip expected. Main threat to #5 again.

DANDYS DUDUDIDUDU

Took out from back, didn't gain much in snappy third panel. Still kept grinding however. Adds Gene tonight.

POORLITTLERICHGIRL

Reserved leaving, first over into far turn, failed to sustain the bid. Would be a surprise.

HI FIDELITY

Parked turn, yielded to quarter mover, slid out 2nd over into lane, urged to get another. The logical favorite again.

DANCERS FANCY

Left fast, yielded mid turn, retook 3/8s, attacked far turn, urged to survive. Mooney's choice in here. Adds to speed equation?

GREEKONA

Left to tuck, brushed back past quarter, attacked near 3/4s, stalled suddenly once passed. Outside again. The plan?

"I can't believe what kind of horse I got," said Graber, who lives in Shipshewana and has been around horses since his childhood. "I started jogging him (just prior to him turning age 2) and I saw right away he was something special. It was just the way he went, and he wanted to go, and he was absolutely perfectly gaited.

"I like the way he's built and the way he can go. He's a beautiful horse and he's smart. He's a nice horse. Everybody likes him. He's a perfect mannered horse except for one thing; he doesn't like you to play with his ears. I have a certain way I have to get the bridle on him. Other than that, he's perfect."

DG's Caviar is a son of Graber's stallion Prime Time Caviar, who passed away two years ago, and his 20-year-old mare Dazzling Kosmos,

Out near half, covered by winner, gapped the flow far turn, kept marching, rallied fast, too late. Also moves inside. Figures tough too.

URINGOODHANDS

1st over half, long grind on rim, urged to lead, held. James choice. Yet another possibility.

HIHOS LITTLE REV

Looped leaving, tucked, quarter moved to top, sped up far turn, some urging, never an anxious moment. The one to beat once again.

WESTERN DEVIL

Parked eighth plus, yielded to quarter moving winner, tracked balance, driven, 2nd best, returned to Quevedo barn. Might fire out again and yield.



CAL EXPO HARNESS

TERMINOLOGY

BOXED IN: A horse that is racing on the rail (or fence) and is surrounded by other horses in front, outside and behind it. A horse that is boxed in is held up and unable to gain a clear passage.

BREAK: To start galloping and lose natural trotting or pacing rhythm. It usually occurs more with trotters than pacers.

BROODMARE: A female horse, generally retired from racing, used for breeding purposes.

CARD: Another term for a program of racing. For example, a person may refer to there being twelve races on the card, it simply means 12 races will be staged that particular day.

CATCH DRIVER: A driver which doesn't train his or her own horses, and is engaged by other trainers and owners to drive their horses.

CLAIMING RACE or CLAIMER: A race where any of the entrants may be claimed (purchased) for a specified amount.

who is no longer able to be bred. Graber also was the breeder of Prime Time Caviar, who won five races and had a mark of 1:57.2 despite battling health issues in his limited career.

"He was a much faster horse than his record," Graber said.

Graber was introduced to Standardbreds when his father bought a retired pacer for the family's 200-acre farm.

"We farmed with horses," said Graber, who grew up Amish. "We used to breed our buggy mare to the stallion, Herbert Patch. They were tough."

When he was in his early 20s, Graber drove in a harness race for the first time at a county fair.

"I was working in construction and quit my

CAL EXPO HARNESS

CLASS: A horse which has raced adequately against better foes may find his way into the winner's circle, while a horse who has beaten inferior foes may find tougher horses not to its liking. A fairly reliable way of checking class is comparing the purses of the previous races and the present race.

COLORS: The special colorful jacket worn by drivers when in a race. Unlike Thoroughbred racing, drivers register their own colors and wear them every time they race.

COLT: A male 3 years of age or less.

CONDITIONED RACE: A race where eligibility is based on age, sex, money won, or races won. For example, "3-year-old fillies, non-winners of \$10,000 or 4 races."

COVER: A horse that races with another horse in front of him is said to race with cover, as the leading horse cuts the wind resistance.

CROSS FIRE: When a horse's hind foot strikes the opposite front foot or leg.

CAL EXPO PICK 3 RULES

1. Any scratch in the first leg of a Pick Three is now a refund.
2. A wager with a scratch in the second leg creates a consolation pool.
3. A wager with a scratch in the third leg creates another consolation pool.
4. A wager with scratches in the second and third leg creates another consolation pool.
5. A consolation pool is the sum of all wagers that include the scratch(es) for that leg or legs. The winning combination for the consolation pool is a wager with the winner or winners of the non-scratch leg(s).

job," Graber said. "I had this pacing mare, Patsys Blue Ribbon. In our first race, I was in front at the half but I got beat. "The next day, I was back at my construction job," he added, laughing.

Graber continued in the construction business for a while before embarking on a 55-year career as a farrier. He also continued to drive in races, until 2015, and train horses on his own half-mile track. The only horse he has trained in the past two years is DG's Caviar.

"I've had a lot of experience in this business, both shoeing and training," Graber said. "I've been up and down the pike a few times."

Last year, DG's Caviar went off stride in all three of his races but was discovered to have an undescended testicle, which was removed.

Rank leaving gate, led, yielded, out past half, battled balance, urged to hold. Adds chip. Figures for a soft trip from pole.

ZACHARIAHS HONOR

Out well before half, uncovered balance, caught by pocket rocket. James choice. Better post. Deserves top billing in here.

YANKEE TIME

3rd over into far turn, came wide, driven, just a mild rally. Fair form. Looking for a likely undercard position.

HE GRINS AGAIN

Led early, yielded, 3hole trip to lane, urged, even. May add to the speed equation. More undercard material.

STORMING D ODDS

Led at once, yielded to quarter mover, stalked to lane, found seam along cones, urged to get it. Quick from the gate. An obvious gimmick must.



CAL EXPO HARNESS

DAM: The female parent, or mother, of a horse. Also a term occasionally used when you take a tough beat in a photo finish.

DEAD HEAT: A situation in which the judges cannot separate two or more horses when judging the outcome of a race.

DISTANCED: A horse that is out of touch with the rest of the field at any point of the race, usually more than 25 lengths behind the leader. This is often referred to as finished distanced.

DRIVER: The person holding a license or permit to drive harness horses. There are different types of licenses, which correspond to differing levels of experience.

EARLY/LATE CLOSER: A race requiring payments which start much closer to the actual race date than a stake "Early" and "Late" involve specified periods of time.

FILLY: A female 3 years of age or less.

PYLON RULE

(For Horses Racing Without Interference)

1. Going inside two (2) pylons and lapped-on at the finish: The offending horse will be disqualified and placed behind any lapped-on horses at the wire.
2. Going inside three (3) or more consecutive pylons: The offending horse will be disqualified and placed last.
3. If an unfair advantage is gained by going inside, over, or in-between one or more pylons in order to pass another competitor: The offending horse will be disqualified.

The steward's discretion applies to all placement.

"People told me the best thing I could do for the horse was to turn him out and let him mature and develop," Graber said. "It was hard for me to do, but I did it, and I got a nice horse."

So far this year, DG's Caviar has won each of his starts by a minimum of 2-3/4 lengths. His best win time of 1:56 is tied for 22nd among all 3-year-old trotters this season.

In addition to the \$1 million Hambletonian Stakes, DG's Caviar is eligible to the Old Oaken Bucket, Circle City, and Indiana Sire Stakes.

"Hopefully he can get to the Hambletonian, but he's going to have to prove himself before that happens," Graber said. "Naturally I'd like to keep on winning. That's what everybody wants, right? I hope he keeps right on going."

Reserved leaving, cover from half, good lead up trip, urged, lugged out some late. James choice in here. Favorable draw again. One of many.

CENALTA COUGAR

Rode cones, failed to get into it. Steve returns. Drops. Still likely longshot.

ROCKINAROUNDHEAVEN

Sat in along cones, easy run to lane, had a clear path, driven, only fair. Easy run expected. Undercard thoughts.

SWEET ONE

Parked eighth plus, released to winner 3/8s, chased balance, urged, many across late. Fair recent form. Small field size helps.

LA MADAWNA DE ROSA

Led at once, retook, yielded half, stalked, cleared, urged, many across. Drops, adds Mooney, one more to consider.



CAL EXPO HARNESS

FIRST-OVER: The first horse to make a move on the leader in a race, moving up on the outside. Those following the first over horse on the outside are second over, third over, etc.

FOAL: A newly born horse. Also describes the act of a mare giving birth.

FREE LEGGED: A pacer which races without wearing hobbles.

GELDING: A castrated male of any age.

HANDICAPPING: The first step in successfully picking a winner (or "handicapping") is becoming familiar with reading the racing program. Each program has a section explaining the information format used at that particular track. Probably the best place to start when handicapping Standardbreds is time. Since over 99 percent of all harness races are conducted at the one-mile distance, valid comparisons can be made among horses.

CHRB Rule No. 1699

(b) A horse shall not interfere with or cause any other horse to lose stride, ground or position in a part of the race where the horse loses the opportunity to place where it might be reasonably expected to finish.

(c) A horse which interferes with another and thereby causes any other horse to lose stride, ground or position, when such other horse is not at fault and when such interference occurs in a part of the race where the horse interfered with loses the opportunity to place where it might, in the opinion of the Stewards, be reasonably expected to finish, may be disqualified and placed behind the horse so interfered with.

Sent under urging, yielded, tracked the balance, faded out a bit late stages. Third start back angle.

CANT HOLD ME BACK MACK

Burst out near half, rimmed the balance, stalled bit late, best of the rest. Ryan takes the call. Plan from outside?

FIVE CARD DRAW

Parked quarter to top, braked, attacked far turn, held tough to end. Drops. Luke's choice. Figures strongly.



CAL EXPO HARNESS

HARNESS: The gear which is used to attach the sulky to a horse, to carry the hobbles and to enable the driver to steer the horse.

HOME STRETCH or STRETCH: The straight length of the track, nearest the spectators, where the finish line is situated. It is called this because it is the final part of the track a horse travels down during a race -- on its run 'home' (or run to the finish line).

HOBBLES/HOPPLES: The straps which connect the front and rear legs on the same side of a horse. Most pacers wear hobbles to help balance their stride and maintain a pacing gait. The length of hobbles is adjustable and a trainer registers the length that best suits his or her horse. There are also trotting hobbles that work through a pulley system to help trotters maintain their gait.

HORSE: A male 4 years of age or older.

STARTER'S RULES

1728. Starter's Control. The starter shall have control over the horses from the formation of the parade until he gives the word 'go.' The starter shall report to the stewards any misconduct or violation on the part of the driver and may order any unmanageable or disabled horse declared (scratched) from the race with the concurrence of the stewards.

1729. Starting the race. The starter shall bring the horses to the starting gate as near one-quarter of a mile from the starting point as the track may permit, and shall endeavor to get all horses away in position and on gait. If a horse refuses to come to the gate, is unmanageable or liable to cause an accident or injury to any other horse or driver, it may be declared and all monies wagered on that horse shall be refunded.

1730. Recalls. The starter may sound a recall for only the following reasons: 1-A horse scored ahead of the gate; 2- There is interference prior to the word 'go' being given; 3-A horse has broken equipment; 4-A horse falls prior to the word 'go' being given. There shall be no recall after the word 'go' is given and any horse, regardless of his position or an accident, shall be deemed a starter from the time he entered into the starter's control unless dismissed.

CAL EXPO HARNESS

INQUIRY: Stewards may conduct an inquiry as a result of any incident which may have occurred during a race, to determine whether or not certain drivers and/or horses were responsible for the incident and whether they should receive due punishment.

INVITATIONAL: A race for the top horses in the area. Also known as an Open or Free-For-All.

LAME: The term used to describe a horse which is limping or has difficulty walking properly, similar to leg cramping, or a Charley-horse.

LEASING: As opposed to buying a harness horse, people have the option of leasing one. Just like some people lease a car instead of paying the money up-front, leasing a horse gives people use of a horse without large capital outlay. An agreement or contract must be drawn up between the two parties, and the lease must be registered with the relevant controlling body.

Pick Four (16%)

To win the **Pick Four**, you must select the winners of the four (4) races designated as the pick four races. Otherwise, pursuant to (CHRB 1976.9):

All living creatures occasionally pay a price for doing something they love to do, need to do, are born to do. Out near half, rimmed balance, kept marching, many across near wire. Mooney's choice. Gotta use in your gimmicks.



CAL EXPO HARNESS

MAIDEN: A horse which has not yet won a race.

MARE: A female 4 years of age or more.

PARI-MUTUEL RACE: A race in which wagering is allowed, held at a track licensed by a state's racing commission. Pari-mutuel races are held at licensed pari-mutuel racetracks or fairs.

PARKED: A horse racing on the outside, with at least one horse between it and the inside rail. A horse on the outside of two horses is said to be **THREE WIDE**.

PHOTO FINISH: When two horses cross the finish too closely to identify a winner, officials call for a photograph of the race, taken exactly at the finish line, to help them determine who was ahead.

POCKET: A horse in the pocket is sitting in perfect position behind the leader, also known as the **two-hole** or the **pocket**.

Horses affect people in ways that can only be felt, not described in words. Left 3wide, parked turn, shuffled back, not a late danger. James choice. Looks awfully strong on paper.

CONTEMPORAY LEGEND

Parked turn to last, out again 3/8s, cover half, led up to lane, many across deep in drive. Outside again. Chip steers here.



CAL EXPO HARNESS

POST POSITION: Generally, the closer a horse starts to the inside rail or barrier of the track (especially on smaller tracks), the better is its chance of winning. At the start, horses must either "leave" (start quickly) to get a good position or else find a place on the rail to avoid racing on the outside of other horses. When racing on the outside the horse is said to be "parked out", and loses ground on every turn. A horse on the inside has a better chance to get to the rail or quickly get a good position.

QUALIFIER: A race in which a horse must go a mile below an established time standard to prove itself capable of competing in pari-mutuel races.

SCRATCHING: A horse that is withdrawn (or scratched) from a race before the start.

SIRE: The male parent, or father, of a horse.

C.H.R.B. BREAKING RULES

1722. Breaking. Should any horse break from its gait in either trotting or pacing, the driver shall:

(a) Where clearance exists, take such horse to the outside.

(b) Attempt to pull the horse to its gait.

(c) Lose ground.

CAL EXPO HARNESS

SIRE STAKE: Stake races designed to promote Standardbred breeding and racing within a state. Different states have different rules regulating eligibility to that state's sire stakes program. Rules include: a horse must be the offspring of a stallion standing in the state or a mare living in that state, owned by a resident of that state, or the horse was born in that state.

STAKE RACE: A race where owners make a series of payments, starting well in advance, to keep a horse eligible. If an owner misses a payment to a stakes race, the horse becomes ineligible.

STARTER: The person responsible for starting a harness race. The starter controls the start of the race from the back of the mobile starting car.

SULKY: Also known as the cart or race-bike, the sulky is attached to the harness and carries the driver and which the horse pulls.
